

DAD'S FT. MONMOUTH JOBS

One of Dad's first jobs at Ft. Monmouth was called an 'editor' for lack of better description. It was like a procurement officer, and he did that for six years. The gist of the job was to print on index cards ('3 X 5 cards') all the supplies and equipment that were allotted for each unit in the army as transportation, medical, repairs, stocks, and supplies for them to operate. In the upper left had corner in capitals was written the name of the supply and a brief description as:

SANDPAPER: 100 GRIT SHEET 8¹/₂ X 11 INCHES

Each index card ('3 X 5') used the same format. In the open space was written an explanation of what it was used for.

Uncle Sid worked at Camp Evans as a group chief. He had Dad transferred to Camp Evans to work with him which was in the metrological division. He worked there for thirteen years. When the metrological division was transferred to Boulder, CO, then Dad and Uncle Sid were transferred to the electronic warfare laboratory at Ft. Monmouth near the 'Hexagon' building until he retired.
